





Artist-in-Residence Program

The mission of the Artist-in-Residence Program is to bring the world's great names in art to the PCC campus to interact with our students in a studio setting thus enriching their lives. Recruited from both the US and abroad, these artists are in Residency on campus for one week during which time an intensive schedule is maintained involving the public as well as the students. At the week's end, the artist presents the school with a work of art completed during that time and which is permanently displayed throughout the College's Shatford Library. Housed in the Research Zone of the first floor of the library are all artist-in-residence posters.

In 1987, Pasadena City College launched this ambitious program. During the residency, each artist exhibits their artwork, and through lectures, demonstrations and student portfolio reviews, works directly with PCC students. Events associated with the program, such as the Forum Lecture, Artist's reception and exhibitions are open to the public.
