Unlike the middle part, we can see the heads looking downwards as if with despair, hopelessness, failure or even sadness. I also noticed that the heads are categorized in groups of circles as if each group refers to something specific that could be tribe, culture, race or even people presenting specific historical era.

Moving to the circle over the head of the crucified statue, I can see stars symbolizing those on the American flag. The Mexican flag also is present as well as the American flag. I can see a
