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Meeting Notes April 18, 2017

1. Major Theme's list from January 31, 2017 meeting consisted of the reoccurring and key concerns the advisory committee shared. Some of feedback provided on the first meeting did not fall under the Committee's purview and were not included on the first draft.
2. The major themes' list will be revised. Some of the members' feedback, even though they are not in the committee's purview but align with the Facilities Master plan and/or current Educational Plan, the feedback will be added to the Major Theme's List. The list will also be prioritized by building projects and categories. Once updated, it will be distributed to the advisory committee prior to the August 22nd meeting.
3. Some Committee members recommended the expansion of Satellite Campuses to more nearby communities. The instituting of additional Satellite Campuses is directly tied with State funding and restrictions attached to the funding. The State controls and has restrictions on the physical growth of the campus. It also holds the community colleges responsible for adhering to the approved 10 year Educational Plan. PCC's Education Plan it will be revisited in 2020-21.
4. Members supported PCC's free shuttle service currently offering transportation from the Community Education Center, Allen Avenue Gold line Station, and the PCC Main Campus. It was recommend to add transportation services from main campus to all the satellite campuses. Some students do not have their own vehicles and limits them to one location. By providing transportation to and from all of PCC's sites, it will allow PCC students to expand their class choices and possibly increase the overall number of students attending PCC and satellite programs.
5. The PCC's Space Inventory was reviewed and the committee members requested for an updated space calculation and classroom space.
6. Currently PCC only has 10% of open space for students' social setting. Ideally, the Campus would have 20% of open space offering students a more welcoming learning and friendlier environment. By providing additional social space, it will allow them to development in both academic and social skills.
7. At the next quarterly meeting the Committee members will review the parallels of the PCC Facilities Master Plan and PCC Educational Master Plan.
