**RESOLUTION NO. 16**  
**ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF PASADENA CITY COLLEGE**

**IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 51, KINDERGARTEN THROUGH COMMUNITY  
COLLEGE PUBLIC EDUCATION FACILITIES BOND ACT OF 2016**

WHEREAS, the California Community College system is the largest postsecondary system of education in the world, enrolling approximately 2.1 million students each year at 72 districts; and

WHEREAS, Article 1, Section 28 of the California Constitution states that public schools, including community colleges, shall be safe, secure and peaceful; and

WHEREAS, California Community Colleges also perform essential functions in the State's interest by providing workforce training and improvement services, remedial instruction, English as a Second Language courses, adult noncredit instruction, and community service courses; and

WHEREAS, the State has met its historic policy of access to higher education by providing consistent State bond capital outlay resources; and

WHEREAS, the California Community College Chancellor's Office estimates unmet community college facilities needs of approximately \$29.2 billion through 2020-21; and

WHEREAS, the State is out of community college capital outlay bond funds and is unable to provide \$478 million for 21 projects approved by the Board of Governors; and

WHEREAS, the Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 ("Proposition 51") provides \$2 billion to community colleges for construction of new classrooms to accommodate enrollment growth, repair of health and safety issues, equipping classrooms with essential technology, and renovation of facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Pasadena Area Community College District has more than \$800 million in facilities needs which may be partially funded by State bonds; and

WHEREAS, passage of Proposition 51 would provide the Pasadena Area Community College District with at least \$60 million to be used to completely reconstruct the U Building on the Colorado Campus, which currently stands unoccupied due to concerns related to its structural integrity and potential for damage from an earthquake; and

WHEREAS, 13,000 middle class jobs are created for each \$1 billion in school facility infrastructure investment; and



WHEREAS, these jobs will be created throughout California and will include almost all building trades; and

WHEREAS, quality community college facilities enhance the education and training of a skilled 21st century workforce, in furtherance of the State's academic and economic goals; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 51 will not raise state taxes.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Associated Students of Pasadena City College states its support for Proposition 51, the Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016, and encourages community members to further educate themselves regarding this measure.

**RESOLUTION NO. 17**  
**ASSOCIATED STUDENTS OF PASADENA CITY COLLEGE**

**IN SUPPORT OF PROPOSITION 55, THE CALIFORNIA TAX EXTENSION TO FUND  
EDUCATION AND HEALTHCARE INITIATIVE**

WHEREAS, during the recent recession, the state cut more than \$56 billion from education, healthcare and other critical services; and public schools statewide experienced unprecedented funding reductions and apportionment deferrals; and

WHEREAS, California public schools rank 42nd out of the 50 states in per-pupil spending; California public schools are the most crowded in the nation; and California provides fewer guidance counselors and librarians per student than any other state in the nation; and

WHEREAS, many of California's schoolchildren come from low-income families that lack access to the health care services needed to keep these children in school and learning; and

WHEREAS, passage of Proposition 30 in 2012 provided an increased investment in California's K-14 school spending by allocating funds directly to K-12 and community college districts through the Education Protection Account;

WHEREAS, the revenue from Proposition 30 will decline after 2016 and will disappear completely after 2018, the last year its provisions will be in effect; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 55 would extend Proposition 30's temporary income tax rates for the top 2 percent of earners for an additional 12 years, to continue funding the Education Protection Account and increase expenditures on healthcare for the lowest income families; and

WHEREAS, unless Californians extend Proposition 30's temporary tax increases for the top 2 percent of earners, our public schools and community colleges will likely suffer significant budget cuts in the years ahead, raising the prospect that California's public education investment will fall even further behind other states in our nation; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of funds from Education Protection Account would represent an estimated cut to California's community colleges of about \$210 million annually; NOW,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Associated Students of Pasadena City College join school districts and community college districts around the state in supporting Proposition 55 and in urging the Legislature to work with the public education community to identify stable, long-term, adequate funding solutions for public schools and community colleges; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Associated Students of Pasadena City College support the passage of Proposition 55 as it provides needed investment in public schools and will specifically benefit the Pasadena Area Community College District for the reasons described herein.

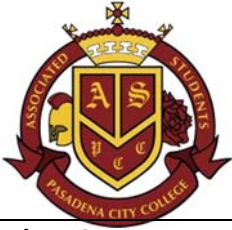
