Board Agenda Item K: Review of Policy 800

Date: 4/20/16

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Executive Board approves the revision of Policy 800 proposed by the Supreme Council.

Purpose:

- The purpose of this rewrite is to improve the structure of Policy 800 and to assign the duties in Policy 800 to positions that are more appropriate to fulfill them.

Original Text:

Procedures for Policy 800

I. Cohesiveness and readability

A. Every summer, prior to the start of the fall semester, all A.S Governing Documents are to be published as a set that must be distributed to any person who requests it.

1. All documents are to have the same format, easily enabling recognition as a complete set.
2. A table of contents must be included with the documents to allow easy location of pertinent information.
3. All documents are to be current as of the date of publishing.
 - a) Any changes made to any of the documents are to be included.
 - b) The date of publishing must be printed on the cover.

B. Changes to any of the documents during the year must be available as an appendix to the published set.

II. Person responsible for the set

Recommended by:

Steven Stark

Chief Justice of the Supreme Council; Associated Students of Pasadena City College

A. A.S Executive Board shall choose a person, as needed, who shall be responsible for carrying out the tasks listed in Part I of this policy and procedure.

1. This person shall also keep a list of all changes made to any of the documents during the academic year.
2. These changes are to be kept in a place that will allow the next person selected for this duty to create the updated set.
3. If, for any reason, the selected person is unable to complete the duties listed herein, the A.S. Executive Board shall choose a new person to carry out the duties at the first regular meeting that the Executive Board is aware of the lack of duties.
4. Failure to carry out these duties without notification to the A.S. Executive Board will be construed as neglect of duty.

B. A workgroup may be appointed to help with these duties by the selection person responsible for the set.

1. The workgroup shall be headed by the person responsible for the set.
2. The person responsible for the set shall be held accountable for the workgroups actions.

Revised Text:

1. Cohesiveness and Readability
 - a. Prior to the end of every ASPCC Term, it shall be the responsibility of the Vice President of Public Relations to publish all A.S. Governing Documents as a set that must be distributed to any person who requests it.
 - i. All documents are to be current as of the date of publishing
 - ii. The date of publishing must be printed on the cover.
 - b. It is the responsibility of the Chief Justice of the Supreme Council to ensure that all governing documents adhere to the following guidelines:
 - i. All documents are to have the same format, easily enabling recognition as a complete set.
 - ii. A table of contents must be included with the Documents to allow easy location of pertinent information.
 - iii. All changes made to any of the ASPCC Governing Documents the previous academic year are to be included in the newly published set.
2. Person Responsible for the Set and Subsequent Duties
 - a. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Council shall have the power to choose a person, as needed, whose duty it shall be to carry out and enforce the guidelines enumerated in Part 1b of this policy and procedure.
 - i. This selected person responsible for the set shall also keep a list of all changes made to any of the Governing Documents during the academic year. These

changes are to be kept in a place that will allow the next person selected for this duty to keep the set updated.

- ii. A most recent version of the Governing Documents must be made by the selected person which shall include all approved changes and/or amendments made within one (1) week of their approval.
 - iii. If, for any reason, the selected person is unable to complete the duties listed herein, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Council shall choose a new person to carry out the duties at the first regular meeting that the Supreme Council is aware of the lack of duties.
 - iv. The Supreme Council may be held responsible in the case of failure to carry out the duties listed in this Part 2a of this policy and procedure without notification to the A.S. Executive Board.
- b. A workgroup may be appointed by the person responsible for the set to assist with carrying out the aforementioned duties.
- i. The workgroup shall be headed by the person responsible for the set.
 - ii. The person responsible for the set shall be held accountable for the workgroup's actions.

Summary:

- The original text of Policy 800 is in strong need of revising its structure, and updating the responsibilities it enumerates to be relevant to the offices that are most suited to fulfill them. This rewrite of Policy 800 reorganizes it in a more readable manner and adds specificity to the responsibilities it delineates. It expands the responsibilities and powers of the Supreme Council relevant to keeping track of changes to the Governing documents, but it does also include an oversight clause so that the Executive Board can ensure that these responsibilities are being carried out. It also gives the responsibility to Publish Governing Documents to the Vice President of Public Relations, which is the most appropriate position to fulfil these duties.

Impact Statement:

- This would Impact specifically the Vice President of Public Relations and the Supreme Council, and generally it would impact every student at Pasadena City College because it would help to ensure that they are able to access the most recent version of the ASPCC Governing Documents.

Recommendation: It is recommended that the Executive Board approves the bylaws titled *Tracking Governing Document* Amendments in by laws, proposed by the Supreme Council.

Title: Tracking Governing Document Amendments in Bylaws

- Bylaws; Article III, Section 9, Clause A, Number 10 | Article VI, Section E

Purpose:

- The purpose of this amendment to the bylaws is to ensure that the responsibilities outlined in Policy 800 are fulfilled, because those particular responsibilities have great significance in keeping track of revisions to the Governing Documents.

Original Text:

- N/A

Revised Text:

Article III, Section 9, Clause A, Number 10

- 10. To publish A.S. Governing documents in accordance with the relevant policy and procedures.

Article VI, Section E

- E. The Supreme Council shall be responsible for maintaining the ASPCC Governing Documents and their cohesiveness and readability in accordance with the relevant policy and procedures.

Summary:

- Currently, Policy 800 is only a policy and until recently the responsibilities outlined in it have all been forgotten about. By inserting these two clauses in the bylaws, the Executive Board and the Supreme Council will now have the obligation to fulfill the vital duties of keeping track of changes to the Governing Documents so that the most recent version can be maintained.
