This was a big relief! After talking briefly to the counselor about her future goals, they decided together to map out an Ed plan that would allow her to transfer to UCI through the Transfer Agreement Guarantee (TAG) program. Several weeks later, Mariana was speaking to one of the classmates in a math class and she shared that she had developed a different plan that would lead to graduating with an Associate Degree from PCC in a shorter time and she could earn a certificate along the way. Now Mariana is not sure which plan to follow.
