I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 8:03 a.m. by Mr. Bill Hawkins.

II. OPEN SESSION

A. PUBLIC COMMENT ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS There was no public comment.

B. ANNOUCEMENTS

Mr. Hawkins recognized and thanked outgoing President, Jim Sarni for his dedicated service as President of the Board. He noted that Mr. Sarni will remain on the board and continue to serve on the Finance & Investment Committee.

C. ACTION ITEMS

1. Approval of Minutes of March 20, 2018 Quarterly Board Meeting

III. REPORTS

D. COLLEGE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Vurdien thanked Lonnie Schield, Ken Hemming and Jim Sarni for their service to the board. He informed the board that at the last Board of Trustees meeting, they approved the \$300,000 of the SCPR funds to become unrestricted.

Dr. Vurdien announced The Aspen Institute team will be on campus on August 27 & 28 to review our campus as part of the process for the Top Community College prize.

Dr. Vurdien noted the PCC budget will have a surplus and PCC will be transferring over \$9 million over the next few years to an irrevocable trust to fund increases in PERS/STRS. The new funding formula from the state will be based on: Year One: Enrollment 70%; Equity 15% and Student Success 15%. Year Two: 65%; 20%; 15%; Year Three: 60%; 20%; 20%. Faculty for the fall will be at 427. We will be hiring two deans – Natural Sciences and Performing and Communication Arts.

E. TRUSTEE LIASION REPORT

In Mr. Hilsman's absence Mr. Sarni referred the directors to the written report in their packets.

F. PCC FOUNDATION PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Hawkins thanked the board members for their service throughout the year and identified several major goals he wants to focus on over the next year. First, under the leadership of Dr. Jack Scott, we will successfully close our IMPACT campaign reaching our goal of \$10 million. Second, we will be developing a business council that will assist the college in identifying internship and employment opportunities for students. Dr. Jim Kossler has agreed to lead another Strategic Plan because we will have completed our 2012 Strategic Plan and will need to set the course for the next 3-5 years. Finally, once the campaign is completed, we will need to create an ongoing development program to continue our fundraising activities.

G. FINANCIAL REPORT

Mr. Winter reported the \$300,000 was approved to continue campaign development.

He also noted investment returns were at 9%, tracking as normal since March 2018.

H. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Abram thanked Lonnie Schield and Ken Hemming for their service on the board and acknowledged the perfect timing of each of the Foundation presidents: Mel Cohen was timely in introducing Ms. Abram to the community when she first arrived; Lonnie Schield developed the strategic plan and trained her on the financial structure of the Foundation and completed the Arts Campaign; John Gregory initiated the public relations program by developing a newsletter and oversaw the gala; Jim Sarni initiated the IMPACT campaign, made a leadership gift, and professionalized the committee structure of the board.

She announced that a new Business Analyst Specialist has been hired and will begin on August 15.

Explanation for Recommendation To Approve Proposed Amendment to the Articles of Incorporation

BACKGROUND:

In recent years, California Community Colleges have increased their focus on ensuring the advancement of an equitable education to all its students. In doing so, needs such as food insecurities have been identified as something that community colleges can address by partnering with other local businesses and non-profits in their communities.

According to a study from the University of California, San Diego, approximately 13-20% of all community college students suffer from food insecurity – not knowing where their next meal is coming from. This insecurity impedes the students' ability to concentrate, and to persist in and to complete their academic pursuits. In fact, most students who experience food insecurity are likely to also be experiencing some level of housing instability. Students experiencing food insecurity and/or housing instability are also more likely to encounter academic challenges as well as experience some level of mental health distress and/or report a poor health status (UC Student Food Access and Security Study, 2016 & US Department of Housing and Urban Development, 2015).

In December 2016, PCC launched "Lancer Pantry", a campus-located food bank that is open to our college community to obtain perishable and non-perishable items for free. As of September, 2018, the pantry was serving approximately 500 students each week.

The food donations to the pantry come through our relationships with local food banks such as LA Food Bank, Union Station, Friends in Deed and local grocery stores such as Ralph's, Pavilions, Von's and Trader Joe's.

In order to maintain our ongoing relationship with the LA Food bank, they are required to partner only with a 501(c)(3) corporation; and that the Articles of Incorporation of that corporation address as a major purpose of the organization, to provide basic food services.

This Amendment is being proposed not only to continue to be a partner with the LA Food Bank, but to give the PCC Foundation a stronger statement of purpose to support the advancement toward an equitable education that may also include providing assistance for other costs of attendance recognized by financial aid funders such as housing, transportation, and child care.

The proposed amendment has been vetted and received approval by our Trustee Liaison, Hoyt Hilsman, PCC President, Rajen Vurdien, and PCC Foundation President, Bill Hawkins.

RECOMMENDATION: To Approve the proposed Resolution to amend the Articles of Incorporation.

 - (b) The general purposes and powers are to have and exercise all rights and powers conferred on nonprofit corporations under the laws of California, including the power to contract, rent, buy or sell personal or real property, provided, however, that this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the primary purposes of this corporation.
 - (c) No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office."

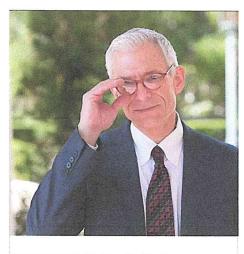
With more than 40 years of journalism and media relations experience, Ralph Frammolino has enjoyed a productive and wide-ranging career on both sides of the press aisle.

II. OPEN SESSION

Mr. Hawkins called the meeting to order on Jim Sarni's behalf at 4:01 p.m.

A. ANNOUNCEMENTS AND RECOGNITIONS

B. PUBLIC COMMENT ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

There was no public comment.



C. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Vurdien noted negotiations have been settled with both unions for a 2 year contract, including a 2% increase.
- 2. The college at this point in the year has a balanced budget.
- 3. Hiring is moving along, this fall the college is projected to have 427 full time faculty.
- 4. PCC has again been awarded the Aspen Prize for Top 10 community college in the nation.

D. TRUSTEE LIAISON REPORT

Mr. Hilsman gave an update on the presidential search and how the process has been revisited. The board of trustees elected to negotiate a contract with Dr. Vurdien under which he would stay on as superintendent/president through the search for his successor, but no later than June 30, 2019. The board approved the creation of a committee to review, suggest changes to, or update its bylaws governing the executive search process. The committee will consist of three members each of the Board of Trustees, tenured faculty, managers and classified staff. The board expects the committee to complete its work before the June 6 business meeting.

An extension to the search timeline was approved, with key dates as follows:

- June 13, 2018: Board approves selection of executive search firm and job announcement
- Sept. 7: Application packages due to the college
- Oct. 17: Board of Trustees select candidates to interview
- Nov. 10: Candidates interviewed and top two or three selected
- Dec. 10-11: Finalists come to campus
- Dec. 19: Selection of superintendent/president
