### **BUSINESS AND COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY**

#### **MODIFICATION – SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description – Effective Summer 2021**

##### **BUS 002 PERSONAL FINANCE**

###### **3 units**

Consumer financial management of financial records and budgets, savings plans, taxes, housing, managing credit, risk management, and investment fundamentals. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** BUS 002 is being reviewed for addition to the CSU GE area B4. Also, for the 2-year cycle, renewal of Form D. SLO3 and corresponding SPO's have been added. The mention of automobile purchasing has been removed from the catalog description. The mention of "weekly" time periods has been removed from the MOI's. The need for algebra skills for spreadsheet use added to CCO's and the use of spreadsheets added to the SPO's. Updated Form D to include the curriculum changes as well as recommended updates to MOI's, MOE's and accessibility.

#### **MODIFICATION – SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description, grade mode, assignments, texts, addition of Distance Education – Effective Summer 2021**

##### **BUS 118 INVESTMENTS**

###### **3 units**

Analysis of stocks, bonds, mutual funds, real estate trusts, commodities, and related investments. Concepts and skills needed to make sound financial decisions, to understand financial statements, interest rates, bond, and stock markets, as well as acquiring, managing and budgeting capital and making financial forecasts. Total of 54 hours lecture.

**Grade Mode:** L, A, P

**Rationale:** Adding a Form D. Update texts, assignments, SLOs, SPOs, CCOS, MOIs, MOEs, grading option, course description. Updated to reflect changes proposed by C&I related to SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, and Form D.

#### **MODIFICATION – prerequisite (removal of HOSP 004 / addition of HOSP 003) – Effective Summer 2021**

##### **HOSP 015 PROFESSIONAL CULINARY FOUNDATIONS I**

###### **3 units**

**Prerequisite:** HOSP 003 and HOSP 014.

**Enrollment Limitations:** Completion of ServSafe Manager Certification

Fundamental culinary principles, techniques and operations with an emphasis on product identification, ingredient handling, recipe costing, commercial recipe development, cooking fundamentals and professional standards of commercial kitchen operations. No credit if taken after CUL 145A. Total of 36 hours lecture and 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU. \*C-ID: HOSP 160X

**Grade Mode:** L, A, P

**Rationale:** Change from corequisite to prerequisites and change HOSP 004 to HOSP 003 for prerequisites. Revised required supplies for students upon enrollment.

**MODIFICATION – course title, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description, units (decrease 10 to 6), assignments – Effective Summer 2021**

**WELD 200A INTRODUCTION TO STRUCTURAL WELDING**

**6 units**

Introduction to welding fabrication for the career welding student. Development of basic skills in oxy-acetylene welding, brazing and cutting. Emphasis on practical Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW) in all positions. Blueprint reading, shop math and welding safety. Required instructional trips. Total of 54 hours lecture and 162 hours laboratory.

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** Revised SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, Methods of Instruction, and Methods of Evaluation, Assignments, textbook reviewed in 2020. Reorganizing the WELD 200A-C program as a prelude to developing 2 separate certificates (A->B and A->C). Course title change. Units reduced from 10 to 6. Catalog change to reflect contact hour decrease.

**MODIFICATION – SLOs, SPOs, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description, units (decrease 10 to 6), assignments – Effective Summer 2021**

**WELD 200B CONSTRUCTION TRADE WELDING**

**6 units**

**Prerequisite:** WELD 200A.

Structural steel welding for the construction trades. Performance of groove welds, in all positions, using Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW) and Flux Cored Arc Welding (FCAW). Class preparation for the written and practical structural certification tests. Study of welding code, destructive testing of welds, layout and fabrication practice, shop math and welding safety. Required instructional trips. Total of 54 hours lecture and 162 hours laboratory.

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** Welding 200B is being reduced to six units to be more manageable for instructors and students. Revised SLOs, SPOs, Methods of Instruction, and Methods of Evaluation, Assignments, textbook reviewed in 2020. Reorganizing the WELD 200A-C program as a prelude to developing 2 separate certificates (A->B and A->C). Reduction in units from 10 to 6. Catalog change to reflect contact hour change.

**MODIFICATION – course title, SLOs, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description, units (decrease 10 to 6)– Effective Summer 2021**

**WELD 200C INTRODUCTION TO FABRICATION GMAW & GTAW**

**6 units**

**Prerequisite:** WELD 200A.

Study of advanced structural steel and aerospace welding. Class preparation for the semi-automatic light gauge certification using Gas Metal Arc Welding (GMAW). Aero-space welding of steel, stainless steel and aluminum using Gas Tungsten Arc Welding (GTAW). Study of welding metallurgy, inspection and nondestructive testing, fabrication practice and welding safety. Required instructional trips. Total of 54 hours lecture and 162 hours laboratory.



**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** Welding 200C is being reduced to six units to be more manageable for instructors and students. Revised SLOs, Methods of Instruction, and Methods of Evaluation, textbook reviewed in 2020. Reorganizing the WELD 200A-C program as a prelude to developing 2 separate certificates (A->B and A->C). Modification to course title, catalog description (spelling error---gauge). Revised contact hours.

**MODIFICATION – changed from an Occupational Skills Certificate to a Certificate of Achievement – Effective Summer 2021**

**BUSINESS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY – ENTREPRENEURSHIP – Certificate of Achievement**

This curriculum focuses on the mindset of an entrepreneur and valuable traits that lead to the successful launch and running of a business. This Certificate program will expose students to a process that strengthens their innovative and creative capacities, and that enables them to apply these attributes to whatever they pursue: starting a business or nonprofit or standing out as an entrepreneurial employee inside a company.

Instruction includes all aspects of critical thinking, creative thinking, problem-solving, innovation, empowerment, personal finance, general business, marketing, and management.

A Certificate of Achievement is awarded upon completion of all required courses with a grade of C or better.

**BUSINESS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY – ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND SMALL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT – Certificate of Achievement**

The Certificate of Achievement in Entrepreneurship and Small Business Management is designed to cultivate the innovative, entrepreneurial skills necessary for today's fast-paced, continuously changing business environment. Students will learn how to think and act flexibly, creatively, and critically. This Certificate provides students of any discipline with the tools and skills required to organize and plan their own business or to innovate within an organization.

A Certificate of Achievement is awarded upon completion of all required courses with a grade of C or better.

**Rationale:** Lowering the units from 22-24 to 16; changing ACCT1A option to ACCT10 due to it being more relevant for the students earning the certificate.

### **ADDITION – Effective Summer 2021**

#### **HOSP 003 SURVEY OF HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT AND MANAGER SANITATION AND SAFETY**

##### **3 units**

Overview of structure and financial performances of hospitality industry; food and lodging, resorts, travel and tourism enterprises, attractions, and related operations. Hospitality foodservice safety, sanitation, and prevention control of food-borne illnesses through Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point management. Preparation for and certification execution of the National Restaurant Association's ServSafe Manager Examination. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** Reasons for the proposal: Submit for C-ID HOSP 100; submit for required core course for AS-T; and submit for Certificates of Achievement. There are three highlights to this new course: (1) it provides an in-class opportunity to earn a certification and it fulfills the required core for (2) four certificates and (3) the associate degree for transfer. First, this new course will provide an opportunity for students to take the hospitality industry-standard Foodservice Manager Certification. Not only does Cal Poly Pomona require this certification (students must earn this independently) prior to starting its hospitality program as of 2019, but industry entities (like restaurants and bars) require at least one certified employee at every property. Therefore, a PCC student who has earned this certification is highly desirable.

### **ADDITION – Effective Summer 2021**

#### **HOSP 005 FUNDAMENTALS OF ENOLOGY, SENSORY EVALUATION, AND BEVERAGE APPRECIATION**

##### **3 units**

**Enrollment Limitations:** Must be 21 years of age

Review of historical and trending wine, beer, spirit, and other alcoholic beverages and styles. Elemental mechanics and influence of agriculture-based beverages on industry practices, safety and liability, appreciation, guest experience, and service. Fundamentals of fermentation, brewing, and distillation with an emphasis on sensory analyses evaluation techniques to define and design product quality, consumer sociocultural preference, and business. Exploration of career opportunities. Total of 54 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU

**Grade Mode:** L, P

**Rationale:** There are four highlights to this new course: it provides an opportunity to earn (1) articulation at the CSU level, (2) three industry certifications and fulfill a required course for (3) five certificates and (4) the AS-T: Hospitality Management.

1) It may be articulated for over six classes across numerous universities such as San Luis Obispo's Fundamentals of Enology to Fresno's Evaluation Techniques.

2) This new course will provide the following three [short-listed] opportunities for students to take the hospitality industry-standard:

(a) the National Restaurant Association's ServSafe Alcohol Certification (ServSafe Alcohol),

(b) the Court of Master Sommeliers Americas Chapter Introductory Level Examination (CMS 1), and

(c) the American Hotel and Lodging Education Institute Guest Service Gold Certification (Gold).

Both the ServSafe Alcohol and CMS 1 Certifications make PCC students hireable for entry- and mid-level food and beverage positions such as restaurant supervisor, food server, barback, wine steward, assistant manager, bar manager, and assistant beverage manager. The Gold Certification is focused on customer service and provides an excellent base for additional training or as a career foundation. Therefore, a PCC student who has earned these certifications is highly desirable in the industry.

### **ADDITION – Effective Summer 2021**

#### **HOSP 021 FOOD, BEVERAGE, AND LABOR COST CONTROL**

##### **3 units**

Financial management of food, beverage, labor, supplies, and other costs within a hospitality operation. Overview of structure and financial performance with an emphasis on problem solving and application of cost control techniques, such as cost, volume, and profit relationships and establishing cost standards, to maximize profits while managing expenses. Customer service, sociocultural trends, and career opportunities are explored. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** The following are four highlights to this new course: it provides an opportunity to earn (1) articulation at the CSU level, (2) one industry certification and fulfill a required course for (3) eight certificates and (4) the AS-T: Hospitality Management.

1) It may be articulated with over five classes across numerous universities such as Pomona's Food, Beverage, and Labor Cost Controls and Long Beach's Cost Control in Hospitality Management.

2) This new course will provide the opportunity for students to take the hospitality industry-standard certification for finance from the American Hotel and Lodging Education Institute: Certification in Hotel Industry Analytics (CHIA). The CHIA is the only hotel-related certification that recognizes the analytics skillset and knowledge that entry-level positions—for instance, assistant revenue managers, corporate staff, and data professionals—available for PCC students' need. The CHIA is offered in partnership with STR, the global source for

benchmarking and forecasting data. A PCC student who has earned the CHIA is highly desirable in the broad financial industry.

3) This new course is elemental for the hospitality management program and is necessary to earn the following select eight certificates (four culinary and four hospitality)

4) Finally, this course may be taken to fulfill a required course for the AS-T: Hospitality Management.

### **DELETION – Effective Summer 2021**

#### **HOSP 004 HOSPITALITY MANAGER SANITATION AND SAFETY**

##### **2 units**

Hospitality food service safety and sanitation practices affecting individual operations. Identifies food-borne illness, contamination, and prevention control of food-borne illnesses through Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point management; proper safe food handling; the flow of food; food preparation; facility and pest management systems; and cleaning and sanitizing. Includes study of worker safety. Preparation for the National Restaurant Association's ServSafe Manager Examination. Total of 36 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU. \*C-ID: HOSP 110

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** Delete this course as the content from HOSP 004 (Archived effective Summer 2021) is now included in a new course: HOSP 003.

### **KINESIOLOGY, HEALTH AND ATHLETICS**

#### **MODIFICATION – SLO's, SPO's, CCO's, MOI, MOE, assignments, texts, grade mode – Effective Summer 2021**

##### **KINA 054A BEGINNING TENNIS**

##### **1 unit**

Development of basic ground strokes: forehand and backhand; volley and serve; rules and scoring; tennis etiquette. Total of 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

**Grade Mode:** L, P

**Rationale:** 6 year review: SLO's, SPO's, CCO's, MOI, MOE, Assignments, Textbooks.

Removed audit as grade mode.

#### **MODIFICATION – SLO, SPO, CCO, MOIs, assignments texts, recommended preparation (removed KINA 054A), grade mode – Effective Summer 2021**

##### **KINA 054B INTERMEDIATE TENNIS**

##### **1 unit**

Development of strokes: forehand and backhand drives, spin serves, overhead strokes; ball, top and

back spins; rules; strategy at the intermediate level. Total of 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

**Grade Mode:** L, P

**Rationale:** 6 year review: SLO, SPO, CCO, texts, MOIs, assignments. Removed recommended preparation of KINA 054A. Removed audit grade mode.

**MODIFICATION – SLO, SPO, CCO, MOIs, assignments texts, recommended preparation (removed KINA 054B), grade mode – Effective Summer 2021**

**KINA 054C ADVANCED TENNIS**

**1 unit**

Development of strokes; lob, smash, spin; approach to net; advanced game strategy. Total of 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

**Grade Mode:** L, P

**Rationale:** 6 year program review: SLO, SPO, CCO, MOIs, MOEs, Assignments, textbooks. Removal of recommended preparation (KINA 054B). Removed audit as possible grade mode.

**MODIFICATION – course title, course number (054 to 054A), SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description, assignments, texts, NCN (30 to 20) – Effective Summer 2021**

**KINT 054A PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES - VOLLEYBALL I**

**2 units**

Analysis of volleyball fundamentals, theory and philosophy of offensive and defensive strategy. Total of 36 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU

**Grade Mode:** L, A

**Rationale:** SLO's, SPO's, CCO's, MOEs, MOIs, Assignments numbered to align with SLO's. Catalog Description, course title. Textbooks revised. Course number changed from KINT 054 to KINT 054A. NCN reduced from 30 to 20.

**ADDITION – Effective Summer 2021**

**KINT 054B PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES - VOLLEYBALL II**

**2 units**

**Rationale:** This course update is to modify CCOs, differentiate SLOs, revise SPOs/MOEs/MOIs, CCOs, assignments, update textbook list, catalog description, NCN (from 35 to 40). Update of Form D.

**SOC 014 INTRODUCTION TO ETHNIC STUDIES**

**3 units**

Focus on the sociological analysis of racial/ethnic relations in the U.S. Examination of immigration issues, colorblindness, white privilege, social and racial justice, and the intersectionality of race, class, and gender. No credit if taken after SOC 014H. Total of 54 hours lecture.

**EDUC 032 CURRICULUM FOR SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN**

**3 units**

Exploration of concepts, theories, and frameworks to design and implement culturally relevant curriculum for diverse school-age children. Examination of the foundations of teaching and learning in the U.S. schooling system and curriculum design in today's classrooms. No Credit if taken after EDUC 132. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit under review.

**Grade Mode:** L, A, P

**Rationale:** The course has not been reviewed in many years and some of the terminology and frameworks were outdated (i.e., “inner city”). An attempt was made to update the course with curriculum models that are being used in today’s schools (Universal Design for Learning, project-based learning, Understanding by Design, among others). Revised SLO’s, SPO’s, MOIs, MOEs, catalog description, textbooks, assignments, and course outline. Updated to also offer the course as a hybrid course (Form D included). Proposing this course for UC transferability. Course was formerly EDUC 132, but is considered different in content from EDUC 132.

**EDUC 050 TECHNOLOGY FOR EDUCATORS**

**3 units**

Exploration of the use of technology for today's TK-12 classroom teachers. Investigation of technological tools for diverse classrooms through hands-on activities, classroom observations, and interactive assignments. No Credit if taken after EDUC 150. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit under review.

**Grade Mode:** L, P

**Rationale:** A lot has happened in the field of education and technology in the last decade. In addition, comparable lower division courses were found at several CSU's. The course is revised in order to become transferable. The title of the course was also revised to expand to additional technologies, instead of just multimedia. Course was formerly EDUC 150.

**SOC 001H HONORS INTRODUCTORY SOCIOLOGY**

**3 units**

**Enrollment Limitations:** Acceptance into the Honors Program.
