BUSINESS AND COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

ADDITION – Effective Summer 2021

Certified Baker – Associate in Science, Certificate of Achievement

19 units

The curriculum offers students valuable hands-on experience and academic rigor to ultimately seek entry and mid-level positions in the baking industry. Individuals seeking to advance and update well-rounded skills in the field will benefit from completion of this certificate. Related local and global baking career opportunities students may enter upon completion include bakers,, production bakers, pastry cooks, and decorators within the following hospitality industries: restaurants, hospitals, retail, catering, lodging, tourism, meeting, convention, and exposition; theme parks; clubs; cruiseline and airway; and service, consulting, and e-commerce businesses and companies. Students are encouraged to pass the Manager Food Safety and Sanitation Certification with a score of at least 75% upon completion of this program in order to supplement their resumes, in addition, it is required for those who intend to transfer to CSU or private universities for Bachelor degrees.

No prerequisite skills are required for enrollment.

This program contains required lab fees, uniform, tool kit and possible Food Safety Certification Registration and exam fees should students decide to complete the exam.

A Certificate of Achievement is awarded upon completion of all required courses with a grade of C or better.

Rationale: The current Baking and Pastry Occupational Skills Certificate listed in the PCC Catalog 2019-2020 is out of date and is in need of significant updates to ensure relevancy for students and employers. The Baking and Pastry program has been dormant for 5 years and 1 Full Time Faculty individual was hired to resurrect courses, revamp curriculum and build the program. Based on an advisory meeting, industry leaders are interested in PCC offering new Baking and Pastry courses under new certificate programs in addition to also providing students with several articulated courses for transferability. To accommodate students with all types of schedules, some courses are available fully online while others are hybrid approved, therefore,

students may enroll full or part time. Students who complete the program requirements are awarded a Certificate of Achievement – Certified Baker. Individuals who complete this certificate will continue to play a key role in maintaining California’s competitive advantage in the market. The current Baking and Pastry Occupational Skills Certificate will be archived in light of this new certificate due to the implementation of substantially modified or new Hospitality Management courses such as HOSP 003 (effective Summer 2021), and the remainder effective Summer 2020: HOSP 014, HOSP 015, HOSP 141, HOSP 140 and HOSP 060 included in this Certificate of Achievement. Because this industry is constantly going through major changes, it is imperative that the degrees and courses reflect the most current and relevant information for employer and industry needs.

ACCT 104B PAYROLL ACCOUNTING

3 units

Recommended Preparation: Enrollment in or completion of ACCT 104A.

Concepts of payroll accounting, including software application. The course is based on the curriculum for the Fundamental Payroll Certification provided by the American Payroll Association. Total of 54 hours lecture and 18 hours laboratory.

3 units

3 units

Rationale: Cisco Networking Academy has released new CCNA curriculum and this course is no longer needed; currently, CIS 041, 042 and 164 are offered for the CCNA curriculum. WebCMS shows that it is part of the CIS - MICROSOFT ENTERPRISE DATABASE ADMINISTRATOR and CIS - MICROSOFTENTERPRISE SYSTEM ADMINISTRATOR certificates. The CIS - MICROSOFT ENTERPRISEDATABASE ADMINISTRATOR certificate was archived in 2018 and I have submitted a proposal to archive the CIS - MICROSOFT ENTERPRISE SYSTEM ADMINISTRATOR certificate.

CIS 190 WEB SERVER DEVELOPMENT

3 units

Rationale: This course has not been updated and offered more than 10 years; it will not be offered anymore. It is not part of any CIS certificates. WebCMS shows that it is part of the CIS - E-COMMERCE OSC certificate, but the certificate was archived in 2017.

ENGLISH

MODIFICATION – catalog description, prerequisite, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, text, Form D update – Effective Summer 2021

ENGL 045A LITERATURE OF THE BIBLE

3 units

Prerequisite: ENGL 001A or ENGL 001AH.

Reading and discussion of books of the Old and New Testaments selected from among the following: Genesis, Exodus, Joshua, Ruth, I and II Samuel, I Kings, Job, Proverbs, Isaiah, Amos, Jonah; Matthew, Luke, Acts, Romans, II Corinthians, other Letters. Analysis of religious, social-political ideas, literary qualities, and questions of authorship and canonization. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: Revision to SLOs, SPOs; CCOs, add MOI, MOE, & assignments; add ENGL 001AH as a prerequisite; update text; add Form Bs; update form D. Modification of catalog description.

MODIFICATION – CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, texts, Form D update – Effective Summer 2021

ENGL 054 CALIFORNIA LITERATURE

3 units

Prerequisites: Eligibility for ENGL 001A or ENGL 001AH or ENGL 001AS.

Literary and historical perspectives of fiction, biography, journals, and letters, about California by California writers. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: Update of CCOs, Methods of Instruction, Methods of Evaluation of Student Performance, assignments, and Update of Texts. Renewal of Distance Education modality.

LANGUAGES

MODIFICATION – SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, text – Effective Summer 2021

ITAL 050 ITALIAN FILM AS DRAMATIC LITERATURE

3 units

Prerequisites: Eligibility for ENGL 001A or 001AH or 001AS.

Italian culture, society, politics and historical periods through the viewing and discussion of Italian films from Neorealism to contemporary cinema. Critical analysis of film types, directors, movements through lecture, discussion, and writing. (Course conducted in English.) Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: We are modifying: SLOs, SPOs, CCO, the methods of instruction, the Methods of Evaluation of Student Performance, the Assignment and the textbook. Addition of Form D. NCN of 25 is the same NCN for all Culture classes. (No change) Within the Languages Division curriculum this course fulfills the need for a course dealing with Italian cinema. As a reflection of socio-political trends in Italy from World War II to present Italian cinema is an essential tool for all those students who wish to acquire a deeper knowledge of Italian society, customs, people and culture.

NATURAL SCIENCE

MODIFICATION – catalog description, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, texts, Form D update – Effective Summer 2021

BIOL 003 HUMAN BIOLOGY

4 units

Introduction to structures, functions, and processes of the human body systems and diseases of those systems from the molecular to whole body levels of organization. This course also includes brief coverage of human development, genetics, evolution and ecology. Specially designed for non-science majors. Total of 54 hours lecture and 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

Grade Mode: L, A

Rationale: We have modified and updated the SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, textbooks, and catalog description as part of the regular six year review cycle and to include changes in response to the tech review. We are also re-submitting the revised form D after completing changes suggested by the tech review.

MODIFICATION – title, catalog description, prerequisite, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, Form D update – Effective Summer 2021

BIOL 004 BOTANY/PLANT DIVERSITY AND ECOLOGY

4 units

Prerequisites: MATH 131 or placement based on the Math assessment process.

Comparative diversity, structure, and function of photosynthetic and fungal taxa. Topics include development, morphology and physiology, taxonomy and systematics. Principles of population and community ecology and ecosystem interactions are emphasized. Total of 54 hours lecture and 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC credit limitations. See counselor.

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: Proposal updates course Title, SPOs, SLOs and CCOs for agreement with current established C-ID155. Course to be offered as a hybrid with the lecture portion online and Fully Online. Addition of MOIs, MOEs, and assignment. Modification of catalog description. Re-added prerequisites, along with Form B. Update of Form D.

MODIFICATION – catalog description, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, Form D update – Effective Summer 2021

BIOL 039 MODERN HUMAN GENETICS

4 units

Exploration of the theoretical and practical applications of human heredity, genetics and biotechnology. Introduction to cellular and molecular biology, Mendelian and molecular genetics, evolution, human genetics, applications of genetic engineering including biotechnology, forensics and molecular medicine. Total of 54 hours lecture and 54 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU, UC

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: To retain course currency with regard to scientific progress in the field and to ensure that the course reflects the most up-to-date course delivery methods. Modification of SPOs, CCOs, and catalog description. Addition of MOIs, MOEs, assignments. Update to Distance Education.

MODIFICATION – title, catalog description, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, assignments, Distance Education addition – Effective Summer 2021

CHEM 008A ORGANIC CHEMISTRY I

5 units

Prerequisite: CHEM 001B.

Fundamental principles and concepts of organic chemistry for science majors. Structure, bonding, nomenclature, isomerism, stereochemistry and physical properties of organic compounds. A mechanistic approach to the reactions of hydrocarbons, alkyl halides, alcohols, dienes, aromatic compounds, organometallics, IR and NMR spectroscopy and mass spectrometry. Introduction to organic laboratory techniques; preparation, isolation and identification of organic compounds. Total of 54 hours lecture and 108 hours laboratory. Transfer Credit: CSU; UC. *C-ID: CHEM 150; CHEM SEQ 160S (with CHEM 008B)

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: 6-yr review. Changed title to "Organic Chemistry I" to distinguish from other course in sequence. Updated textbooks. Made minor edits to SLOs to distinguish them from 2nd course in the sequence. Updated SPOs. Updated and reformatted CCOs. Updated MOIs and MOEs. Updated Assignments and aligned to SLOs. Updated catalog description (removed "No credit if taken after..."). Added Form D for hybrid (emergencies only).

MODIFICATION – title, catalog description, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, Distance Education addition – Effective Summer 2021

CHEM 008B ORGANIC CHEMISTRY II

5 units

Prerequisite: CHEM 008A.

Second semester course in a 2-semester sequence covering organic chemistry for science majors. A mechanistic approach to the reactions of alcohols, phenols, ethers and epoxides, aldehydes, ketones, carboxylic acids and their derivatives and amines. Photochemistry, organic redox, polymerization, rearrangements, synthesis and an introduction to biochemical molecules. Qualitative analysis, natural products, multistep synthesis and kinetics. Total of 54 hours lecture and 108 hours laboratory.

Transfer Credit: CSU; UC. C-ID: CHEM SEQ 160S

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: 6-yr review. Changed title to "Organic Chemistry II" to distinguish from other course in sequence. Updated textbooks. Made minor edits to SLOs to distinguish from the 1st course in the sequence. Updated SPOs. Updated CCOs. Update catalog description (removed "No credit if taken after..."). Added Form D for hybrid (emergencies only).

MODIFICATION – catalog description, SLOs, SPOs, CCOs, MOIs, MOEs, contact hours, assignments, texts, – Effective Summer 2021

PYSO 100 BASIC PHYSIOLOGY AND ANATOMY

3 units

Fundamentals of human physiology and anatomy. Structure and function of tissues, organs and organ systems. Emphasis on medical relationships. No credit if taken after ANAT 025, PYSO

001. For students in medical assisting and vocational nursing, but open to all qualified students. Total of 36 hours lecture and 54 hours laboratory.

Grade Mode: L, A, P

Rationale: The purpose of this modification is to add Form D to Physiology 100. Required updates were made to SLOS, SPOs, CCOs, assignments, and texts. Modification of catalog description, MOIs, and MOEs. Course units were revised per tech review in order to reduce hours (lecture reduced from 54 to 36). Lab increased 36 to 54.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

MODIFICATION – catalog description, SLOs, SPOs, assignments, text, Form D update – Effective Summer 2021

CHDV 015 CHILD, FAMILY AND COMMUNITY

3 units

Recommended Preparation: CHDV 010 and PSYC 021, 021H, or 121.

Examines the developing child in a societal context which focuses on the interrelationships of family, school, and community and emphasizes historical and socio-cultural factors. The processes of socialization and identity development will be highlighted, showing the importance of respectful, reciprocal relationships that support and empower families. Total of 54 hours lecture.

Transfer Credit: CSU. *C-ID: CDEV 110

Grade Mode: L, P
